READING IS THE KEY TO SUCCESS (RITK) IS A SCHOOL-WIDE ACTIVITY THAT TAKES PLACE THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL YEAR. STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO READ EVERYDAY AND ARE AWARDED FOR READING.



PURPOSE

- ✊ TO IMPROVE STUDENT READING AND LITERACY SKILLS
- ✊ TO ADDRESS LEARNING LOSS/READING INTERVENTION
- ✊ TO PROMOTE A HOME-SCHOOL CONNECTION
- ✊ FOR STUDENT RECOGNITION (EOS/EOY AWARDS ARE GIVEN TO TOP READERS)



HOW DOES IT WORK?

GENERAL

1. Students read independently at home.
2. Students and/or parents complete the Reading Log.
3. Submit the Reading Log to teachers every week.
4. Reading Logs will be returned to students every week.

5. Time spent reading will be converted to points that students earn for awards and recognition.

6. Top Student Readers receive certificates at the end of the semester, and at end of the school year.

- Students with the most reading points are considered Top Readers

CONVERSION

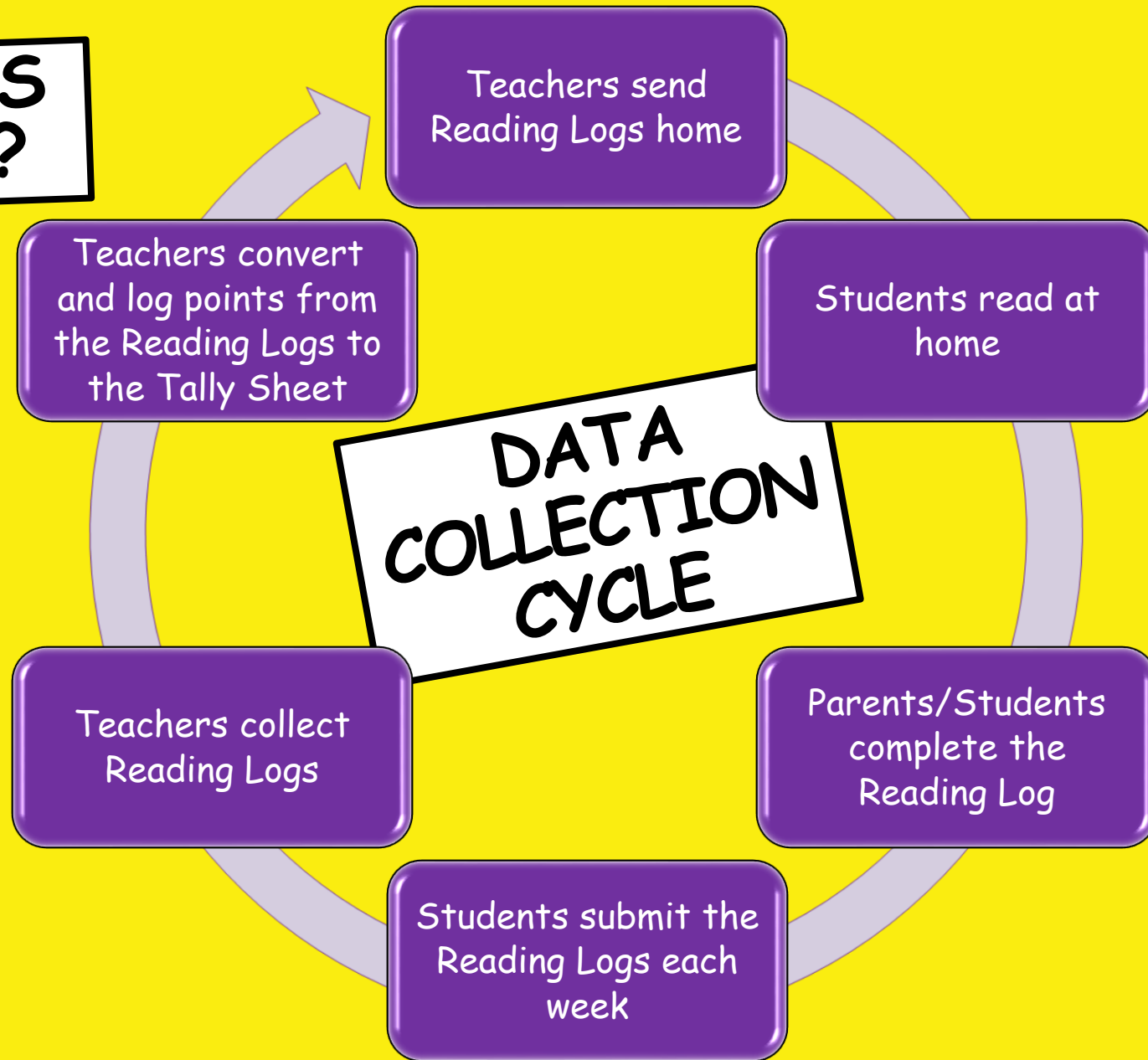


READING TIMES ARE CONVERTED TO POINTS:

- **TamES:** every 20 minutes spent reading equates to 1 point earned.
- **LBJ:** every 10 minutes equates to 1 point earned.

Points are calculated at the end of each semester.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

END OF SEMESTER

- 👉 Teachers submit the Tally forms to RITK Reps/Librarians.
- 👉 Librarians will analyze data and determine the Top 5 Readers for each grade level.
- 👉 Top 5 Readers receive a certificate during their library time.

END OF SCHOOL YEAR

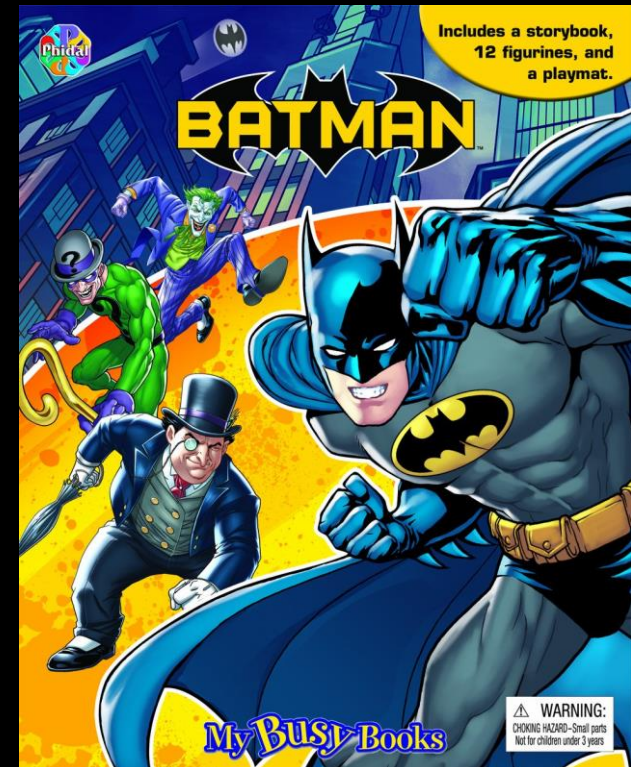
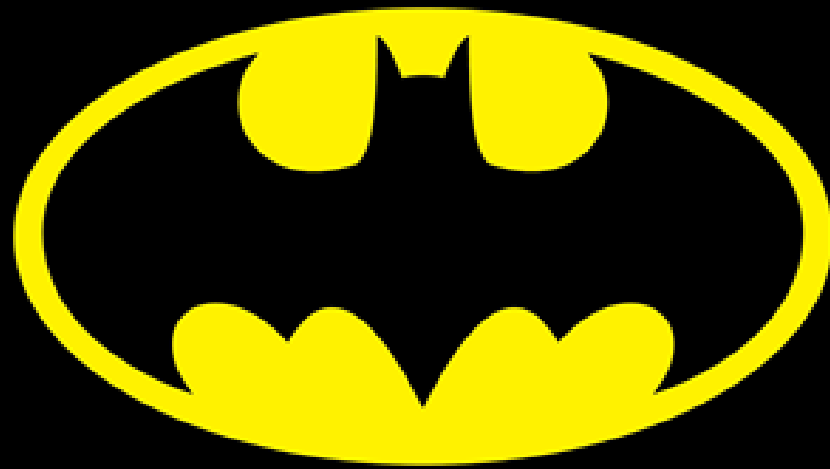
- 👉 Librarians will analyze data and determine the Top 3 Readers per GL (highest cumulative points).
- 👉 Top 3 Readers receive a certificate and a trophy during their class ceremonies.



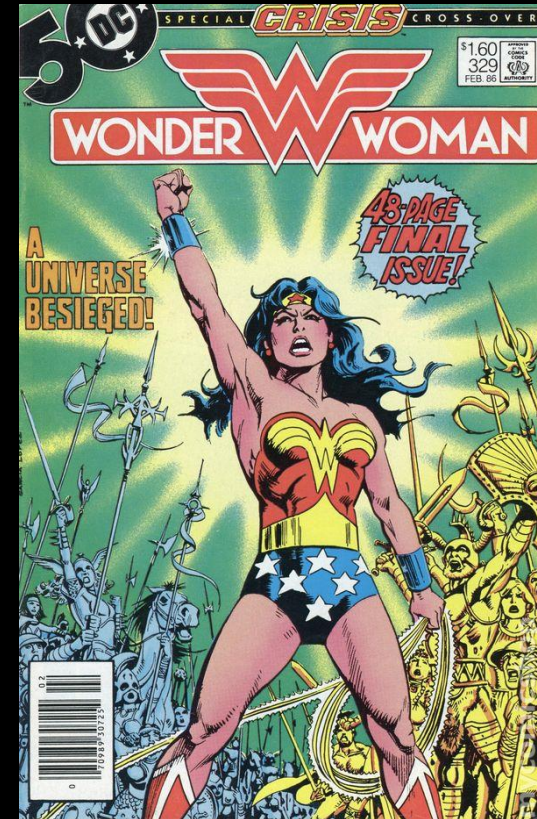

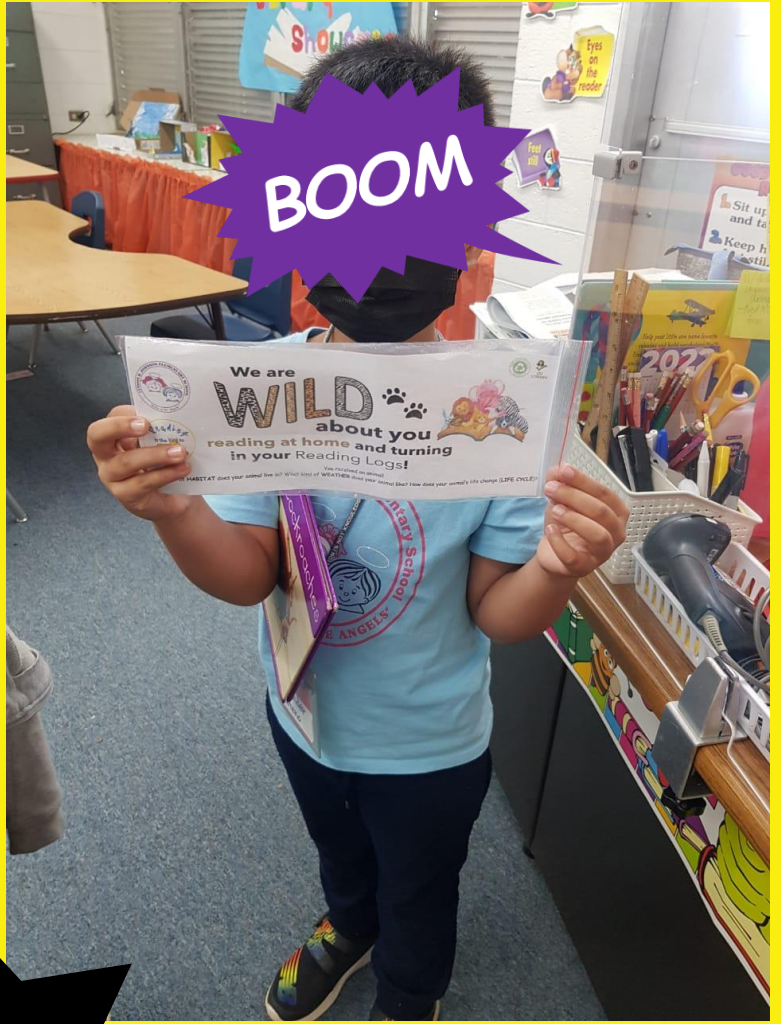

The Library Showcase is a celebratory extension of Reading is the Key to Success (RITK), in which students show their understanding of a story through creative expression in a diorama project. Student projects are displayed at LBJ and TamES Libraries for patrons to view.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Students create diorama projects at home with their family.

- Dioramas are submitted to librarians for display.
- Libraries will feature dioramas for one week per grade level.
- Librarians/judges will critique dioramas using a point-scoring rubric.
- Librarians award RITK points to students based on the rubric.
